## **Committee Reports:**

Transportation Services: Councillor Glass and Mayor Cameron gave a verbal report.

- With the storm that happened at the end of May, a lot of trees were knocked down. Removed trees with Darren.
- All streets are graded. Grass was cut a couple of times.
- The RM of Longlaketon is sending their skidsteer with brush cutter and grapple bucket to hall out more trees and clean up some piles. Hoping for Friday the 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> cleanup.
- There were free trees given away to residents from WUQWATR for their Tree of Life Program at the RM McKillop office. The Village received free trees as well, they are small, so they are temporarily planted in Councillor Gorrill's yard until they grow more.
- Culverts that need to be fixed are on Railway Avenue and across from the Co-op is flattened, we can maybe put an extension on it.
- A concerned resident called Mayor Cameron after the storm went through Bulyea. There was a tree falling down, it was leaning towards the street. They were concerned of it falling on someone as the roots were pulling out of the ground. Mayor Cameron put up barricades to block the street for everyone's safety. The resident chopped the tree down the next day.

Utilities: Councillor Gorrill and Mayor Cameron gave a verbal report

- Lines were flushed last Saturday. We should flush lines once a month going forward to clear it all out.
- Next flush will be July/August.
- Mayor Cameron talked to Tim regarding the aggressive line flush the Village is going to try to clear out the pipe buildup. Administrator to make a poster that the water can't be used from midnight to 6am because we will be flushing a heavy dose of chlorine down the lines to help with the orange color that we see in the water. Then we will flush again in the fall before freeze up. We think this is due to not enough flushing prior and years of build up.
- There is a new curbstop going in on Withington Street for the new build. Water will be off for about a half hour Friday in the morning due to the waterline tie in. Admin to update the voicemail, post online and notify the businesses in town.
- Councillor Gorrill picked up the curbstop in the city. Darren and Brian measured and put the stakes down for Victor. Road barricades set up to keep traffic off the road while they dig.

Hall: Councillor Dmyterko gave a verbal report.

- The Hall is thankful for the online calendar on the Village website.
- The Hall would like an online application created as well that would state the name, how long needing, type of event, what day and if set up is needed.
- The hall would like to create a memorable spot, would like to use the empty village lot with the bench. They would like to sell placks for the people who have lived here for years. The Village is ok with using the Village lot for this.

Health: Councillor Lovequist gave a verbal report

- The next meeting is this coming Monday. Nothing new to report yet.

Last Mountain Regional Landfill: Mayor Cameron gave a verbal report

- Hired a part time person to help the current part time employee at the landfill. There is a shift coming to get someone else up to speed. The current Administrator Jenna is busy dealing with a new pit with contractors and engineer. She will be stepping back from the day to day Administration.
- Interviewed 2 people. Used the Village office. We hired Tiffany Hymers. She is an Admin with the Health Office in Strasbourg. She will be working 10 hours a month for the Landfill. She has lots of experience with the Health office.
- Struggling at the Landfill for space right now. The 30 yard roll off bins will not be coming to the dump anymore. They will be going to Regina. There is lots of garbage in those recycle bins. They pay per weight.
- Debit machine being set up to help when people don't have cash.
