**Business Licenses (\$25 per year)**

**Dog/Cat Licenses are DUE EACH YEAR**

**The limit of 2 dogs and/or 2 cats remains in effect. - \$50 Fine.**

The license fee shall be:

- (i) for each dog - \$15.00
- (ii) for each neutered dog - \$10.00
- (iii) for each cat - \$15.00
- (iv) for each neutered cat - \$10.00

## **2023 Municipal By-Election**

The Village of Bulyea is holding a By-Election.

*In order to run in the municipal election for the Village, you must be:*

- at least 18 years of age on Election Day.
- a Canadian citizen the day the Nomination Paper is submitted.
- a Saskatchewan resident for six consecutive months prior to the day the Nomination Paper is submitted.
- resident of the municipality for at least three consecutive months prior to the day the Nomination Paper is submitted.

### **How is a Municipality Governed?**

Municipalities are governed by a council of elected officials. They make decisions by passing resolutions, setting policies or enacting bylaws. Bylaws are the laws of the municipality.

### **What is the role of Council?**

The main role of council is to make decisions about the services the municipality will provide to citizens. Council establishes policies/bylaws about what services to provide, how those services will be delivered and at what levels. The Municipal Administrator is then in charge with implementing those policies and bylaws. Council relies on the support, advice and assistance of the Administration through the decision-making process.
